UNDERAGE PLAYERS CODE OF CONDUCT AND BEST PRACTICE

- Do not use foul or abusive language under any circumstances.
- Treat all players, as you would like to be treated.
- Co-operate with your Team Manager and Mentors, club members, and you opponents. Avoid negative behaviour associated with forming groups or cliques.
